“The Redistricting Cycle in American State Politics”

My dissertation explores the implications of the “redistricting cycle” with respect to strategic party decision-making. The redistricting cycle is a feature of modern (post-*Baker v. Carr*) American politics in which redistricting is a predictable occurrence following each decennial Census, and its consequences include changes in competitiveness, incumbent decision-making, and party behavior. In the first part of my dissertation, I examine cyclical effects from the perspective of party organizations, through two essays on the allocation of resources to legislative candidates. The second part of my dissertation develops a theory of party strategy in the redistricting process itself.
